SCARECROW COMPETITION (for groups or individuals)

The best scarecrow will win £10, the 2nd best £5 and the 3rd prize winner £3. All entries should be self-supporting and fixed in the Playing Field by the side of the Hall.

DIVISION A: VEGETABLE, FRUIT AND FLOWER


1. An exhibition of Garden Vegetables, displayed on a flat table space up to 24" x 24", for the Richard West Trophy.
 2. 3 specimens of the same vegetable.
 3. Collection of 6 Culinary Herbs.
 4. An exhibition of Garden Fruit, displayed on a flat table space up to 12" x 12".
 5. 6 Sticks of Rhubarb.
 6. Sweet Peas: one vase of 6 Stems colours by choice. The Macklow Memorial Cup.
 7. Roses: 3 stems floribunda, one or more varieties.
 8. Roses: 3 blooms hybrid tea, one or more varieties.
 9. Roses: one specimen.
 10. Roses: any one rose judged purely on fragrance.
 11. Roses: 3 stems miniature/patio rose, one or more varieties.
 12. Pansies: three heads. The stems should go through holes in cardboard to a water jar.
 13. 20 Stems of Lavender.
 14. An exhibit of Mixed Garden flowers not less than 5 kinds, not arranged for effect.
 15. An exhibit of mixed Garden Shrubs/foilage, not less than 3 types, not arranged for effect.
 16. 3 stems of one variety of flower not already in Schedule.
 17. A Cactus or Succulent.
 18. A plant grown from seed, seedling or cutting since Autumn 2009.
 19. Pot plant grown for foliage tended by exhibitor for at least 3 months.
 20. Pot Plant in Flower tended by exhibitor for at least 3 months.
 21. "A Pot for the Patio", planted for effect. Home grown or bought material.
 22. A Hanging Basket, to be displayed on an inverted flowerpot supplied by exhibitor, home grown or bought material.
- ### DIVISION B: FLORAL ART
23. Miniature Buttonhole, not to exceed 4" In length.
 24. An exhibit to illustrate "A Holiday". Maximum size 24 " high (from the table) and 24" wide
 25. An exhibit illustrating "A Formal Dinner Party". Maximum size 24" high (from the table) and 24" wide.
 26. A vase of flowers, vase can be any colour or shape: size restricted to 24" high (from the table) and 24" wide.
 27. A petite exhibit of cottage garden flowers in fresh material not to exceed 9".

DIVISION C: DOMESTIC

28. 3 Hen Eggs displayed on a plate. (Other materials may be used for display purposes).
29. Jar of Home Made Jam.
30. Jar of Home Made Marmalade.
31. Jar of Home Made Curd, any flavour.
32. Jar Home Made Jelly.
33. Jar of Pickle or Chutney.
34. 5 Cheese Scones.
35. A Victoria Sponge, any shape or size and own recipe.
THIS IS THE ELIZABETH CUP CLASS – THE FIRST **THREE** PRIZEWINNERS ARE REQUIRED TO DONATE THEIR CAKES FOR AUCTION.
36. A Marble Cake (recipe given). Limited to entrants who have not won a prize in the Elizabeth Cup class in the last 5 years.
37. A French Apple Tart.
38. A yeast-risen Loaf **NOT** made in a bread maker.
39. A Yeast-risen Italian bread, started in a bread maker using your own recipe.
40. A Sewn, Knitted or Crocheted Garment.
41. An Article of Handicraft involving Sewing and/or Knitting and/or Crochet.
42. An Article of Needlework including Counted Thread and/or Tapestry and/or Needlepoint **NOT** made from a commercial kit and/or design.
43. An article of Needlework including Counted Thread and/or Tapestry and/or Needlepoint made from a commercial kit and/or design.
44. A Patchwork/Quilted article.
45. A Monochrome Drawing (any medium).
46. A Painting (any medium).
47. An Artificial Flower made from any material – up to 3 stems.
48. An article of Handicraft, not in Classes 40 to 44 made from a commercial kit or design.
49. An article of Handicraft, not in Classes 40 to 44 **NOT** made from a commercial kit or design.
50. A Handmade Greetings card made from a kit or digital picture.
51. A handmade Greetings card **NOT** made from a commercial kit or design.
52. Objets Trouvés displayed on a card not larger than 12" x 12" (Not to have been previously shown).

Objets Trouvés

These are objects "found" anywhere such as rocks, stones and pebbles in various shaped, colours and sizes: driftwood (remember the size limit) or plant material such as odd shaped carrots also the many varieties of shells, off-cuts of wood which have not been worked on in any way and so on.

53. "A Special Person", black and white or coloured; maximum dimension 12" (30.5 cm).
54. Animals or Birds, black and white or coloured; maximum dimension 12" (30.5 cm).
55. A Landscape, black and white or coloured; maximum dimension 12" (30.5 cm).

Sizes given in Classes 53, 54 and 55 are of photographs, excluding the mount.

56. A "Themed Collection", black and white or coloured, mounted on A3 size card.
57. A Cross-section of Fruit or Vegetable digitally enhanced photograph, mounted on A4 card.

DIVISION D: YOUTHS (18 years and younger)

58. 4 x Decorated Fairy Cakes (recipe given).
59. A plant grown from seed, seedling or cutting since Autumn 2009.
60. A Painting or Drawing (any medium).
61. A design for the front of this Schedule – "Radley Flower Show 2011. Schedule and Entry Form".
62. A Greetings Card.
63. An article of Handicraft in hard or soft material.
64. A photograph of Animals or Birds, black and white or coloured, mounted on thin card.

DIVISION E: CHILDREN (under Secondary School age)

65. A Recycled Vehicle to fit on A4
66. A Collage Fish to fit on A4.
67. A Fruit and Vegetable Creature.
68. Flowers in a jam jar.
69. Cress or Grass grown in a decorated Polystyrene Cup.

Note: A child may enter classes 1 – 69 and a "Youth" may enter classes 1 – 64
