



OXFORDSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL (RADLEY) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) (EXPERIMENTAL) ORDER 2016

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that on 24 October 2016 Oxfordshire County Council made the above experimental Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of this Order, which comes onto force on 7 November 2016 is to **Prohibit Waiting at Any Time** in the following roads:

- CHURCH ROAD both sides of its junction with Church Road/Foxborough Road and over the bridge into Lower Radley Road.
- FOXBOROUGH ROAD both sides for most of the road to its junction with St James Terrace, except short areas opposite Nos.95/97 and outside Nos.104/106.
- Also into the junctions with St JAMES TERRACE for 40metres and STONHOUSE CRESCENT for 13.5metres.

This Order contains provisions allowing the Director for Environment and Economy to modify or suspend the Order or any provisions of the Order (if appropriate) in accordance with Section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Experimental Order will remain in force for a maximum period of 18 months. If the provisions of this experimental Order are made permanent, the appropriate order will be made.

The Council will consider in due course whether the provisions of the experimental Order should be continued in force indefinitely. Any person may object to the making of an Order for the purposes of such indefinite continuation within a period of 6 months (a) beginning with the day on which the experimental Order comes into force (25 April 2016) or (b) if that Order is varied by any order made by the Council or modified by the Director for Environment and Economy of the Council pursuant to section 10(2) of the 1984 Act, beginning with the day on which the variation or modification comes into force.

Documents giving more detailed particulars of the Order are available for public inspection at County Hall, New Road, Oxford, OX1 1ND, from 8.30am to 4.30pm Monday to Friday, and at Kennington Library Kennington Road OX1 5PG from 2pm to 5.30pm Monday, 10am to 12.30pm Wednesday, 2pm to 7pm Friday, and 10am to 1pm Saturday.

If you wish to question the validity of the experimental Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on grounds that any requirement of this Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to this Order, you may within 6 weeks from 24 October 2016 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

Any such objection must be in writing and state the grounds on which it is made and all objections and other representations must be sent to the Director for Environment and Economy at the address below within the stated time period. The County Council will consider objections and representations received in response to this Notice. They may be disseminated widely for these purposes and made available to the public.
